A new name for *Sinocallis* HONG, 2002
(Hemiptera: Aphidomorpha: Drepanosiphidae)

ABSTRACT. A new name *Hongocallis* is proposed for the genus *Sinocallis* HONG, 2002.

In 2002 Y.C. HONG erected a new genus based on the new species of fossil aphid *Sinocallis clypeolata* HONG, 2002 from the Chinese amber (HONG 2002). Unfortunately the name *Sinocallis* had been preoccupied by a genus of recent aphid *Sinocallis* TSENG & TAO, 1938 (TSENG & TAO 1938). At the present the name *Hongocallis* is proposed for *Sinocallis*.
